OPCC ANNUAL SURVEY 2025 RESULTS OVERVIEW

This autumn, the PCC invited the public to complete a safety survey to understand how safe they feel in their community, how visible and connected they feel to Dorset Police, and whether police resources are being used effectively locally.

The feedback helps assess how well the Police and Crime Plan and the Chief Constable's Policing Vision are understood and delivered. It highlights areas of success and identifies where improvements may be needed, informing internal discussions and further action. Serious concerns can be raised with the Force, while positive outcomes may be shared publicly.

The results will also support policy development within the OPCC, improve Dorset Police's understanding of public perceptions, and be shared with relevant stakeholders and partners.





Repeated themes of comments:
