

## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO 2018-022

Your request has now been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) and we provide our response below.

## You asked:

What budget has your Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner set aside for the costs associated with commissioning Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) services? This might include staff costs, legal costs, cost of market engagement events etc. Please supply the answer as total budget for the financial year 2018/19.

Your request for information has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) and our response is as follows:

The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) does not set aside specific budgets for commissioning against any priority.

However, there are a number of services locally that the Commissioner commissions, funds or supports – either solely or with partners – which support female victims of crime (either specifically or as part of the wider service provided). The table below summarises these services for 2018/19.
