

## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO 2019-019

Your request has now been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) and we provide our response below.

## You asked:

How many times did the PCC/Mayor write directly to the Former Prime Minister Rt Hon Theresa May MP during her time in office both as Prime Minister and Home Secretary for the following reasons:

- A. Raising concerns that budget cuts were having a detrimental effect on policing
- B. Requested more money? How much was requested how much was given (if any)?
- C. Raised concerns that budget cuts were putting officers at risk

Your request for information has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) and our response is as follows:

The PCC wrote to Theresa May at least four times during her time as Home Secretary and Prime Minister, as follows:

- In December 2014, with the Chief Constable outlining that he felt that budget cuts were putting officers at risk;
- In November 2015, asking for a fairer funding settlement for Dorset;
- In December 2015, highlighting the impact of budget cuts on port security; and
- In November 2018, recognising the economic benefits of working in collaboration.

The PCC has also written to a number of others with the ability to influence funding for Dorset Police including:

January 2013	to the Chancellor of the Exchequer regarding police budgets
March 2013	to the Policing Minister regarding the police funding formula
June 2013	to the Policing Minister further on the police funding formula
November 2013	from all South West PCCs to the Policing Minister regarding budgetary pressures
February 2014	to all Dorset MPs regarding budgetary pressures
August 2014	to the Prime Minister mentioning budgetary pressures

January 2015	to the Policing Minister regarding the police funding formula
July 2015	to the Policing Minister mentioning the police funding formula
July 2015	to all Dorset MPs regarding budgetary pressures
November 2015	to all Dorset MPs regarding budgetary pressures
November 2015	to the Chancellor regarding police budgets, raising concerns relating to the capacity of Dorset Police
January 2017	with the Chief Constable to the Police Resources Unit, Home Office regarding the provisional police grant report
February 2017	to all Dorset MPs urging them to lobby for better funding
December 2018	with the Chief Constable to the Home Secretary regarding budgetary pressures
