Your request for information has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) and our response is provided below:

No information held. However, the 2014 Victims Support contract (in place until 2019) provided a 'Victims of Crime Definition" – this means that victims of stalking and harassment were covered by this grant. Information about this contract is provided in the tables below.

Additionally, the OPCC recommissioned the Victim Services Contract in 2019/20 which stated:

"An enhanced entitlements service is also to be provided to victims who fall within the following specified categories:

"Persistently targeted victims – defined as a victim being targeted repeatedly as a direct victim of crime over a period of time, particularly if deliberately targeted or a victim of a sustained campaign of harassment or stalking."
