For information, the PCC is not the only local commissioner of domestic abuse and sexual violence, with Dorset Council and BCP Council both commissioning emergency housing for victim's domestic abuse, and service for victims classed as medium risk. NHS England also commission Sexual Violence Therapeutic Services.

Domestic Abuse Support for Standard Risk Victims	Victim Support	Practical and emotional support to victims of domestic abuse categorised as "standard risk".
The Maple Project	Dorset Police	Provides a service to victims of domestic abuse categorised as "high risk". To ensure that women, men and children who are affected by domestic abuse receive a high level of support and protection and perpetrators are held accountable for their actions and behaviour
The Shores (Dorset SARC)	G4S Forensic Medical Services	To provide immediate support to victims of sexual abuse and assault, and the provision of Forensic Medical Examiners for victims of sexual assault.
Independent Sexual Violence Advisors (ISVAs)	STARS - Dorset Rape Crisis	Provision of ISVAs to provide targeted support to victims of sexual violence, including providing advice regarding the criminal justice process. Including a Child and Young Person ISVAs and a Male ISVA. Service Co-commissioned with NHS England.
Counselling of Victims of CSA	STARS - Dorset Rape Crisis	Face to face emotional support for women, men and transgender survivors of sexual assault or rape.
